Pre-Season: Annual Trout Restocking (April)






The Hunting & Fishing Committee oversaw the restocking of our lake and stream with beautiful trout from the Paradise Trout Hatchery, just up the road.

Sunday Worship










Social Hall was filled with collections/collectibles and other treasures of all kinds.


